# HONOR SCHOOL SAFETY PATROLS NEXT MONTH

### 73 to Get Awards for 1948-49 Record

Civic leaders, educators, and police officials will participate in ceremonies Nov. 7 in Franklin school, 225 Evergreen av., honoring safety patrols from 73 north side public and parochial elementary schools.

The awards will be presented boys and girls "who gave unselfishly of their time to protect their schoolmates," Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club said. The certificates, given by the club, are for "meritorious service during 1948-49."

This is the seventh consecutive year the Motor club has honored patrols having a record of no fatalities or injuries among school children at crossings protected by patrols.

#### Established in 1922

The school safety patrol program was established in 1922 by Hayes. Since then membership has grown nationally to 460,000 members in 12,000 schools serving 8 million children. There are more than the Chicago area.

In Chicago, the accident fatality rate has dropped approximately 45 per cent since 1922, while the adult fatality record has shown an increase of approximately 45 per cent in the same period.
